

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Overview

Mentoring Kings is a hybrid (in-person and online) critical mentoring and literacy intervention geared toward male high school students of color. A distinguishing feature of Mentoring Kings is that it seeks to improve student literacy using the Hochman Method's explicit note taking instruction and is guided by the fundamental principles: unity, self-determination, collective work & responsibility, cooperative economics, purpose, creativity and faith.

The Problem

- 17.6% of Black boys acquire a GPA of 80% or higher by the 12th grade (Degrees NYC, 2021).
- 25.4% of Latinx boys acquire a GPA of 80% or higher by the 12th grade (Degrees NYC, 2021.
- The National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), indicated that 13 percent of fourth-grade Black boys score proficient in reading; in eighth grade, 11 percent of Black boys (Roland, 2011).
- 80% of parents in the U.S. were concerned about their child's mental health & development since the pandemic began. Black & Latino parents reported even higher levels of concern (Innovate Public School, 2021).

The Solution

- Both formal and informal mentoring have the potential to benefit boys of color in a range of areas, including academics, social-emotional well-being, mental health, and preventing risky behaviors.
- The Hochman Method creates a common language around note-taking and writing, by explicitly instructing students how to take notes using keywords, phrases, abbreviations and symbols.
- Getting trained in specific note-taking strategies can significantly improve the quality of notes and the amount of material students remember later. (Boyle, 2013; Rahmani & Sadeghi, 2011; Robin, Foxx, Martello, & Archable, 1977). This is especially true for students with learning disabilities.
- According to the Center for Child Well-Being (2010), parental involvement in their children's learning not only improves a child's morale, attitude, and academic achievement across all subject areas, but it also promotes better behavior and social adjustment.


Highlights


- MK After-School Intensives: weekday touchpoints

- MK University: (Saturday/Academic Support Session from 11AM-2PM)

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




Mentoring Kings: APRCHS Academy
